Jesus and Mary, at Calvary, your hearts beat as one in perfect obedience and surrender to God's plan for our salvation.

Now in glory you intercede for us so that we may receive the blessing of light and mercy that we need.

O Sacred Heart of Jesus, our only Lord and Savior, Let your kingdom of truth and life, of holiness and grace, of justice, peace and love come now upon the earth.

Immaculate Heart of Mary, be our refuge in all the adversities and dangers we face. Triumph over our fears, difficulties, weaknesses, temptations and infidelities.

Gather us into the Kingdom of your Son, who lives and reigns with the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit one God, forever and ever. Amen.

3 Intentions and Scripture Readings for Each Day

DAY ONE: FOR THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

INTENTION:

Today we bring to your Immaculate Heart Oh Mother Mary,
Our Holy Father Pope Francis,
all our bishops, the clergy and consecrated persons and lay leaders.
Be with them as you were with the first disciples.
Weave their lives with Jesus in the Eucharist

SCRIPTURE READING: ACTS 2: 42-47, 4: 32-35

Reader: A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Those who were baptized devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers.

Awe came upon everyone, and many wonders and signs were done through the apostles. All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their property and possessions and divide them among all according to each one's need. Every day they devoted themselves to meeting together in the temple area and to breaking bread in their homes.

They are their meals with exultation and sincerity of heart, praising God and enjoying favor with all the people. And every day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.

DAY TWO: FOR THE GOVERNMENT LEADERS AND CIVIL SERVANTS

INTENTION:

SCRIPTURE READING: JAMES 3: 13-18

Reader: A reading from the letter of Saint James

Who among you is wise and understanding?

Let him show his works by a good life
in the humility that comes from wisdom.

But if you have bitter jealousy and selfish ambition in your hearts,
do not boast and be false to the truth.

Wisdom of this kind does not come down from above
but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic.

For where jealousy and selfish ambition exist,
there is disorder and every foul practice.

But the wisdom from above is first of all pure,
then peaceable, gentle, compliant, full of mercy and good fruits,
without inconstancy or insincerity.

And the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace
for those who cultivate peace.

DAY THREE: FOR FARMERS AND ENVIRONMENTALISTS

INTENTION:

Today we bring to your Immaculate Heart, O Mother Mary those who till the land and those who care for our natural resources so that there may be food for all, balance of creation preserved and restored, and justice and human rights upheld and promoted for the well-being of all. Amen.

SCRIPTURE READING: DEUTERONOMY 8: 7-11, 18

Reader: A reading from the book of Deuteronomy

For the LORD, your God, is bringing you into a good country, a land with streams of water, with springs and fountains welling up in the hills and valleys, a land of wheat and barley, of vines and fig trees and pomegranates, of olive trees and of honey, a land where you will always have bread and where you will lack nothing, a land whose stones contain iron and in whose hills you can mine copper. But when you have eaten and are satisfied, you must bless the LORD, your God, for the good land he has given you.

Be careful not to forget the LORD, your God, by failing to keep his commandments and ordinances and statutes. Remember then the LORD, your God, for he is the one who gives you the power to get wealth, by fulfilling, as he has now done, the covenant he swore to your ancestors.

SCRIPTURE READING: ISAIAH 58:6-11

Reader: A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah

Thus says the Lord: Is this not, rather, the fast that I choose: releasing those bound unjustly, untying the thongs of the yoke; Setting free the oppressed, breaking off every yoke? Is it not sharing your bread with the hungry, bringing the afflicted and the homeless into your house; Clothing the naked when you see them, and not turning your back on your own flesh? Then your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your wound shall quickly be healed; Your vindication shall go before you, and the glory of the LORD shall be your rear guard. Then you shall call, and the LORD will answer, you shall cry for help, and he will say: "Here I am!" If you remove the yoke from among you, the accusing finger, and malicious speech; If you lavish your food on the hungry and satisfy the afflicted; Then your light shall rise in the darkness, and your gloom shall become like midday; Then the LORD will guide you always and satisfy your thirst in parched places, will give strength to your bones And you shall be like a watered garden, like a flowing spring whose waters never fail.

Give each one in our families your faith, your hope, and your love and courage. Let the Fathers and the men be like Joseph and learn to be responsible, respectful and just. Let the mothers and women be like you, strong, loving and wise. Let the young grow in grace and knowledge, in good health and joy. Let the old and the preborn be protected and equally be respected with full human dignity. Amen.

SCRIPTURE READING: COLOSSIANS 3:12-21

Reader: A reading from the letter of Saint Paul to the Colossians

do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another, if one has a grievance against another; as the Lord has forgiven you, so must you also do. And over all these put on love, that is, the bond of perfection. And let the peace of Christ control your hearts, the peace into which you were also called in one body. And be thankful.

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, as in all wisdom you teach and admonish one another, singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God.

And whatever you do, in word or in deed,

Wives, love your husbands, as is proper in the Lord. Husbands, love your wives, and avoid any bitterness toward them. Children, obey your parents in everything, for this is pleasing to the Lord. Fathers, do not provoke your children, so they may not become discouraged.

SCRIPTURE READING: SIRACH 6: 32-37

Reader: A reading from the book of Sirach

If you wish, you can be taught; if you apply yourself, you can be shrewd. If you are willing to listen, you can learn; if you pay attention, you can be instructed. Stand in the company of the elders; stay close to whoever is wise. Be eager to hear every discourse; let no insightful saying escape you. If you see the intelligent, seek them out; let your feet wear away their doorsteps! Reflect on the law of the Most High, and let his commandments be your constant study. Then he will enlighten your mind, and make you wise as you desire.

DAY SEVEN: FOR OUR CHRISTIAN BROTHERS AND SISTERS

INTENTION:

Today we bring to your Immaculate and Sorrowful Heart, O Mother Mary, our Christian brothers and sisters.

We all carry the name of your Son Jesus, bear his cross, and proclaim his Gospel.

We all acknowledge you to be the mother of Jesus, though some do not accept you to be their mother too. Show yourself a mother to them.

As we work together in common areas

keep the paths of dialogue open and help us develop mutual respect, so that we can reach out to one another in fraternal charity and give living witness to the presence of the Risen Lord. Like the early disciples,

SCRIPTURE READING: JOHN 17: 20 - 26

Reader: A reading from the holy gospel according to John

Jesus said:

"I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me. And I have given them the glory you gave me, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may be brought to perfection as one, that the world may know that you sent me, and that you loved them even as you loved me. Father, they are your gift to me. I wish that where I am they also may be with me, that they may see my glory that you gave me, because you loved me before the foundation of the world. Righteous Father, the world also does not know you, but I know you, and they know that you sent me.

I made known to them your name and I will make it known, that the love with which you loved me may be in them and I in them." The gospel of the Lord.

SCRIPTURE READING: EZEKIEL 18: 21-23, 30-32

Reader: A reading from the book of the prophet Ezekiel

If the wicked man turns away from all the sins he has committed, if he keeps all my statutes and does what is just and right, he shall surely live. He shall not die!

None of the crimes he has committed shall be remembered against him; he shall live because of the justice he has shown.

Therefore I will judge you, house of Israel, all of you according to your ways.

Turn, turn back from all your crimes,

that they may not be a cause of sin for you ever again.

Cast away from you all the crimes you have committed, and make for yourselves a new heart and a new spirit.

Why should you die, house of Israel?

For I find no pleasure in the death of anyone who dies

Reader: A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah

A shoot shall sprout from the stump of Jesse, and from his roots a bud shall blossom. The spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him: a spirit of wisdom and of understanding, A spirit of counsel and of strength, a spirit of knowledge and of fear of the LORD, and his delight shall be the fear of the LORD. Not by appearance shall he judge, nor by hearsay shall he decide, But he shall judge the poor with justice, and decide fairly for the land's afflicted. He shall strike the ruthless with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall slay the wicked. Justice shall be the band around his waist, and faithfulness a belt upon his hips. Then the wolf shall be a guest of the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the young goat; The calf and the young lion shall browse together, with a little child to guide them. 
By you we will be led to Christ your Son and Only-Begotten Son of God, and by Him and with Him to His Eternal Father.

6 Hymn to our Lady



THE INTRODUCTORY RITES

When the people are gathered, the Priest approaches the altar with the ministers while the Entrance Chant is sung.

Entrance Antiphon Ps 12: 6

My heart will rejoice in your salvation.

I will sing to the Lord, who has been bountiful with me.

When he has arrived at the altar, after making a profound bow with the ministers, the Priest venerates the altar with a kiss and, if appropriate, incenses the cross and the altar. Then, with the ministers, he goes to the chair.

When the Entrance Chant is concluded, the Priest and the faithful, standing, sign themselves with the Sign of the Cross, while the Bishop, facing the people, says:

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

The people reply:

Amen.

Then the Priest, extending his hands, greets the people, saying:

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

Or:

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Or:

The Lord be with you.

In this first greeting a Bishop, instead of The Lord be with you, says:

Peace be with you.

The people reply:

And with your spirit.

The Priest, or a Deacon, or another minister, may very briefly introduce the faithful to the Mass of the day using these or similar words:

Brothers and sisters,

today we celebrate the memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary and, in union with all the Dioceses of the Philippines, we, the people of God, make an Act of Consecration to the Immaculate Heart of our mother.

We venerate Mary

especially those in need.

for she is the Mother of God, the Mother of Christ, and the Mother given to us by Christ as he hung upon the cross. She is for us a model and image of the Church, one who is united with Christ and filled with His Spirit, and whose heart beats with that of her Son.

Her heart is full of the love and compassion of her Son.

We, too, are called to be like Mary, to be more and more one with Christ, to have hearts where the Holy Spirit dwells, to have hearts which beat with that of Christ, and so have love and compassion for our brothers and sisters,

PENITENTIAL ACT

therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

The absolution by the Priest follows:

The people reply:

Amen.

The absolution by the Priest follows:

The people reply:

GLORIA

The Gloria in excelsis (Glory to God in the highest) is said.

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will.

We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory,
Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father.

Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son,
Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

COLLECT

When this hymn is concluded, the Priest, with hands joined, says:

Let us pray.

And all pray in silence with the Priest for a while. Then the Priest, with hands extended, says the Collect prayer:

God, who prepared a fit dwelling place for the Holy Spirit in the Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary, graciously grant that through her intercession we may be a worthy temple of your glory. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

The people acclaim:

Amen.

The word of the Lord.

The people reply:

The Lord make poor and makes rich, he humbles, and also exalts.

He raises the needy from the dust, from the dung heap he lifts up the poor, to seat them with nobles and make a glorious throne their heritage."

Then follows the Alleluia.

Alleluia See Luke 2:19

Alleluia, alleluia. Blessed is the Virgin Mary who kept the word of God and pondered it in her heart. Alleluia, alleluia. If incense is used, the Priest puts some into the thurible. After this, the Deacon who is to proclaim the Gospel, bowing profoundly before the Priest, asks for the blessing, saying in a low voice:

Your blessing, Father.

The Priest says in a low voice:

May the Lord be in your heart and on your lips, that you may proclaim his Gospel worthily and well, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, ₹ and of the Holy Spirit.

The Deacon signs himself with the Sign of the Cross and replies:

Amen.

If, however, a Deacon is not present, the Priest, bowing before the altar, says quietly:

Cleanse my heart and my lips, almighty God, that I may worthily proclaim your holy Gospel.

The Deacon, or the Priest, then proceeds to the ambo, accompanied, if appropriate, by ministers with incense and candles.

GOSPEL LK 2:41-51

The Deacon, or the Priest, says: The Lord be with you.

The people reply: And with your spirit.

The Deacon, or the Priest: A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

and, at the same time, he makes the Sign of the Cross on the book and on his forehead, lips, and breast.

The people acclaim: Glory to you, O Lord.

The Gospel is proclaimed.

Each year Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, and when he was twelve years old,

they went up according to festival custom.

After they had completed its days, as they were returning,

the boy Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem,

but his parents did not know it.

Thinking that he was in the caravan,

After three days they found him in the temple,

sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions, and all who heard him were astounded at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him, they were astonished, and his mother said to him, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." And he said to them. "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" But they did not understand what he said to them. He went down with them and came to Nazareth. and was obedient to them: and his mother kept all these things in her heart.

Then follows the Homily, which is to be preached by a Priest or Deacon.

The Creed is not said.

Prayer of the Faithful

The Priest initiates the Universal Prayer from the chair.

Sharing in the joys and sorrows of our brothers and sisters, let us pray for them and lift our petitions to God our heavenly Father, and let us say: Lord, hear our prayer.

The petitions are announced from the ambo.

1. For the Pope, Bishops, clergy, consecrated persons and lay people, so that they may follow Christ more intensely, be united with him more deeply and be of greater service to God through His People especially the poor, let us pray to the Lord.

- 2. For those in government, elected officials, civil servants, the police and the armed forces, that they may be guided in their work for the welfare of the Filipino people so that there may be justice, truth, peace and development in our country, let us pray to the Lord.
- 3. That people may take better care of the environment and restore the balance of nature so that all may live in a world that is healthy for all and where there is food and resources for everyone, let us pray to the Lord.
- 4. That all sectors of the economy may work in harmony with each other for the development of our country, that all may get a just share of the fruits of their labors and that all may share in the growth of the economy, let us pray to the Lord.
- 5. That there may be more love and care in all families, that parents may nurture their children so that they may reach their full potential, that children may love and obey their parents, and that the elderly and the unborn be taken good care of, let us pray to the Lord.
- 6. That our teachers may be strengthened in their mission to share their knowledge with their students, and that students may become more diligent so that they may come to know truth, which is ultimately, God, let us pray to the Lord.
- 7. That all those who believe in Christ may come together into one flock, one family of God, one Body of Christ, let us pray to the Lord.
- 8. That those who do not believe in God and those who turned away from God may come to know God and turn to him, may they live to do good and show justice to all, let us pray to the Lord.
- 9. That all people and nations may shun violence and war and instead work for the betterment of the lives of all, let us pray to the Lord.

The Priest concludes the Prayer:

Loving God, you give us Jesus Christ who became one like us in all things, and Mary, who is one of us to be our mother and example.

We make our prayer for those they love and care for.

Hear our prayers and grant that we may live in your grace through Christ our Lord.

The people acclaim:

Amen.

The people acclaim:

Amen.

Having been made partakers of eternal redemption, we pray, O Lord, that we, who commemorate the Mother of your Son, may glory in the fullness of your grace and experience its continued increase for our salvation. Through Christ our Lord.

The people acclaim:

Amen.

The follows the Act of Consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. All kneel down in front of an image of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The Bishop or Priest leads in the Act of Consecration.

ACT OF CONSECRATION TO THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY "We have recourse to your protection, O holy Mother of God." As we recite the words of this antiphon with which the Church of Christ has prayed for centuries, we find ourselves today before you, our Mother, in this Year of Faith. We, who make up the Body of Christ present in our land, recite the words of this present Act of Consecration and Entrustment, in which we gather, first of all, the hopes and anxieties of our Filipino people, at this moment of our history.

Mother of our people,
we rejoice in the name, *Pueblo amante de Maria*,
a people who love Mary,
bayang sumisinta kay Maria.
You know all our sufferings and our hopes,
you who have a mother's awareness
of all the struggles between good and evil,
between light and darkness,
which afflict the world today.
Mother of our people,
accept the cry which we,
deeply moved by the Holy Spirit,
address directly to your heart.

Embrace, with the love of the Mother and Handmaid of the Lord, our people and our land, which now we entrust and consecrate to you, for we are truly concerned for the earthly and eternal destiny of every individual among us and for all our people. "We have recourse to your protection, O holy Mother of God; despise not our petitions in our necessities."

Behold, as we gather before you, Mother of Christ, as we gather before your Immaculate Heart, we desire, the Church of the Lord in our land, joined in heart and mind with all our people, isang bayang Filipino,

to unite ourselves with the consecration which, for love of us, your Son made of himself to the Father:
'For their sake,' he said, 'I consecrate myself that they also may be consecrated in the truth'
We wish to unite ourselves with our Redeemer in this his consecration for the world and for the entire human race, which, in his divine Heart, has the power to obtain pardon and to secure reparation.

The power of this consecration by your Son, Our Lord, lasts for all time and embraces all individuals, peoples and nations. Thus also it embraces our people and our land. The power of this consecration overcomes every evil that the spirit of darkness is able to awaken, and has, in fact, awakened in our times, in the hearts of men and women in human history.

How deeply we now feel the need for the consecration of our people, in union with Christ Jesus himself.

For the redeeming work of our Redeemer must be shared in and by the world, and by our own people, through the Church.

We turn to you, Mother of our Redeemer and our Mother: above all creatures may you be blessed, you, the Handmaid of the Lord, who in the fullest way obeyed the divine call. Hail to you, who are wholly united to the redeeming consecration of your Son.

Mother of the Church, enlighten the People of God along the paths of faith, hope and love. Help us to live in the truth of the consecration offered by Jesus your Son for the entire human family, and for us, the Filipino people and for our beloved land.

In entrusting to you, O Mother, our people, your "Pueblo amante de Maria,"

we entrust to you this very consecration itself, placing it in your motherly Heart.

Immaculate Heart, help us to conquer the threat of evil, which so easily enters and takes root in the hearts of people today, and whose immeasurable effects already weigh down upon our country, and seem to block the paths toward the future.

From hatred, violence, and conflicts which divide and destroy our people, deliver us.

From sins against human life, from its very beginning, deliver us.

From the demeaning of the dignity of the children of God, deliver us.

From every kind of injustice in the life of society, deliver us.

From readiness to trample on the commandments of God, deliver us.

From the loss of awareness of good and evil, deliver us.

From sins against the Holy Spirit, deliver us, deliver us.

Accept, O Mother of Christ, this cry, laden with the hopes and burdens, the sufferings of each one of us, and of all our people.

Help us, with the power of the Holy Spirit to overcome and conquer all sin; individual sins and the sin of the world, sin in all its manifestations.

Let there be revealed once more, in our own history as a people, the infinite power of the Redemption, the power of merciful love. May it destroy the power of sin and evil among us. May it transform consciences.

May your Immaculate Heart reveal for all, in our land and through all the world, the light of hope!

O Mary, Mother of Jesus and our Mother, our life, our sweetness and our hope!

Representatives of the different sectors of the Diocese may offer flowers to the image of the Blessed Mother while an appropriate song is sung (e.g. Immaculate Mother).

The deacon, or the Priest says

May God, who through the childbearing of the Blessed Virgin Mary willed in his great kindness to redeem the human race, be pleased to enrich you with his blessing.

R. Amen.

May you know always and everywhere the protection of her, through whom you have been found worthy to receive the author of life. R. Amen.

May you, who have devoutly gathered on this day, carry away with you the gifts of spiritual joys and heavenly rewards. R. Amen.

And may the blessing of almighty God, the Father, and the Son, № and the Holy Spirit, come down on you and remain with you for ever. R. Amen.

Dismissai

Then the Deacon, or the Priest himself, with hands joined and facing the people, says:

Go forth, the Mass is ended.

Or: Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord.

Or: Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life.

Or: Go in peace.

The people reply: Thanks be to God.

Then the Priest venerates the altar as usual with a kiss, as at the beginning. After making a profound bow with the ministers, he withdraws.
